


# jControl Guide: Apple® iPad®


#### Connecting jControl to your head unit

The jControl app requires a Bluetooth connection with your head unit in order to function. The app will not be able to connect to the head unit unless your mobile device is already connected by Bluetooth.

**Pairing:** If you have never connected your mobile device to your head unit before, you must first pair the mobile device. Refer to your head unit Owner's Manual or Quick Reference Guide for the specific steps to pair your mobile device.

**Connecting**: Just because your mobile device is now paired to the head unit does not mean they are always connected. After the initial pairing of your device, it should automatically connect to the head unit. In future sessions, you can easily connect again from the Bluetooth settings of your mobile device, as shown below.






Note: The head unit will connect to the last connected device upon power on, as long as that device is within range and Bluetooth is on.

After your mobile device is connected to your head unit, open the jControl app. The app should now connect to your head unit within a few seconds. If you are not able to connect, refer to the Troubleshooting section.

Note: Some models may only have Zone volume controls (found in Audio Settings) and no master volume control.

Note: The JWM90A volume adjustment controls the volume for the currently active zone instead of Master Volume.



## **Troubleshooting Steps**

- 1. Check the Bluetooth settings on your mobile device to confirm you are connected to the head unit.
- 2. Ensure proper Bluetooth connection by streaming music from your phone to the head unit.
- 3. From your mobile device settings, turn off Bluetooth by tapping the button shown below. Tap again to turn Bluetooth back on. Tap on the head unit name under "MY DEVICES" to reconnect to the head unit.



4. If you still cannot get the app to function, unpair the head unit from your iPad (tap the "i" icon next to the device and then tap "Forget"). Perform a factory reset on the head unit. Repeat the pairing steps according to the Owner's manual or Quick Reference Guide.
